The ACCT Foundation Inaugural Chinese Canadian Leaders' Summit will bring together 100 established and emerging leaders to share leadership journeys, insights and recommendations for Chinese Canadian leadership development.

The Leaders' Summit also offers an opportunity for a Roundtable on the state of Canada's Chinatowns (from disappearing Chinatowns to efforts on conservation of Chinatowns).

The Roundtable intends to provide interactive learnings on community efforts and issues for consideration relative to future developments and conservations of Chinatowns. Through presentations and sharing of current and past efforts; insights and experiences on the protection and conservation of Chinatowns in key regions of Canada; participants will gain awareness and deeper understanding on related issues, threats and insights at the city, regional as well as Canada-wide levels.

The Roundtable offers Calgarians the opportunity to glean from other similar initiatives and broaden as well as deepen relevant stakeholders and impacted community's understanding and on the issues.
