Conversations on the glaring underrepresentation of Chinese Canadians in public offices, public services, key institutions, and civic society over recent decades prompted founding members of the Action! Chinese Canadians Together (The ACCT Foundation), to establish an entity in 2017 that would lead the needed deliberations to critically examine the persistent underrepresentation of Chinese Canadians in leadership roles, and to engage and mobilize collective efforts to support those who aspire to lead.

We aim to bring together established and emerging Chinese Canadian leaders to collaborate on identifying and breaking down systemic barriers to the full and equal participation of ethno-cultural leaders in Canadian society.

Our Chair



Teresa Woo-Paw is a tireless advocate for diversity, social inclusion and active civic participation. She is known for her ability in bringing diverse people together to joint efforts, break new grounds and create bigger impacts in society.

She is the first Canadian woman of Asian descent elected to the Calgary Board of Education (1995-2000), the Alberta Legislature and Cabinet Minister in Alberta (2008-2015).

Teresa holds a bachelor of arts degree in social work from the University of Calgary. She founded and built eight non-profit entities over a span of 40 plus years including the ACCT Foundation & Asian Canadians Together-ACT2EndRacism National Network; Asian Heritage Foundation, the Ethnocultural Council of Calgary (Action Dignity) and the Calgary Chinese Community Service Association. She has worked with almost 100 organizations in Canada.

Teresa received appointment as the Chair of the Canadian Race Relations Foundation by the Governor in Council in 2018 and is currently Chair of ACCT Foundation and created the Inspire to Lead Leaders' Summit and the Aspire to Act Leadership Training Program; Convener of ACT2EndRacism Network; Co-Chair of Asian Heritage Foundation; Board member of Calgary Arts Foundation; City of Calgary-Tomorrow's Chinatown and Lougheed House Advisory Committees.

National Remembrance Event on June 23

- A National Remembrance event will be held in the Senate of Canada Chamber to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the passing of the Chinese Exclusion Act.
- This event will also be livestreamed from the Senate of Canada building and community members across the nation are invited to host viewing parties to participate.
- A commemorative plaque will be unveiled as part of the ceremony with the intent to have it installed permanently in the newly renovated Centre Block of the Parliament of Canada.
- Following the event, ACCT, Senator Woo, and the Senate of Canada invite attendees to a reception in the Senate of Canada Building, celebrating Chinese Canadian history through song, dance, poetry, and a historic exhibition. Light refreshments will be provided.
- The consequences of the Chinese Exclusion Act will continue to be discussed throughout the Summit on June 24 and 25.



June 24-25 Program

The theme this year is on resilience and building social cohesion. We will bring together intergenerational Chinese Canadian leaders from across Canada to develop resources to empower current and future generations of Chinese-Canadian civic leaders.

We will start the Summit with an intercultural dialogue on what it means to bear witness to what has happened to other racialized groups and how Chinese Canadians can become allies in their own leadership journey. We will then dive deeper into leadership topics that will include:

- Chinese Canadians in Unexpected Places
- Do you know what you don't know?
- Being comfortable in your own skin

This gathering of Chinese Canadian leaders will provide a forum to share experiences, discuss current thinking, develop insights on leadership, and spark collaborations to support lasting collective impact.

The Summit will then end with a roundtable on Saving Canada's Disappearing Chinatowns.
